

# Hoof Nipper

## Description

A **Hoof Nipper** is a powerful, plier-like tool designed to **trim and shape the hard outer wall of an animal's hoof**. With long handles and strong, sharp blades, it gives farriers, veterinarians, and livestock handlers the leverage and precision needed to remove overgrown hoof material safely and efficiently. It's one of the primary tools used in hoof maintenance for large animals, especially horses and cattle.

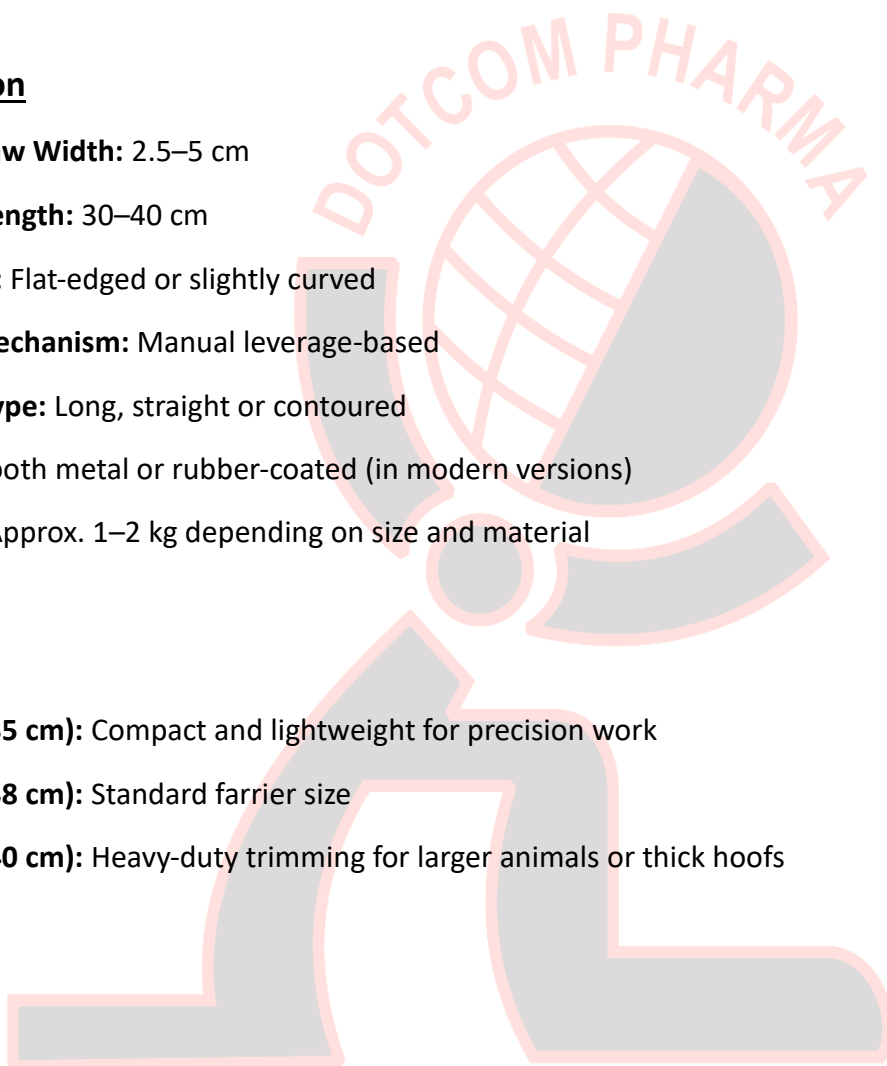
- **Cutting Jaw Width:** 2.5–5 cm

## Usage

Used to **clip off the hard wall of the hoof** that overgrows naturally. It helps restore proper hoof shape, allows for balanced weight distribution, and prevents issues like hoof cracking, lameness, and joint strain. Also used to prepare hooves for shoeing or further treatment.

## ✓ Advantages

- Strong cutting force for minimal hand effort
- Clean, controlled hoof shaping
- Available in multiple sizes for tailored use
- Durable materials for long-term farm and clinic use
- Reduces risk of overgrowth-related injuries in animals

## ✗ Disadvantages

- Incorrect use can damage hoof or injure animal
- Heavy tool may cause hand fatigue if used long without rest
- Needs regular sharpening or replacement if blade chips
- Not effective for soft hoof sole or inner cavity — only wall trimming

## ⚠ Precautions

- Ensure animal is properly restrained
- Do not cut too deep — risk of cutting into sensitive laminae
- Use both hands for controlled trimming
- Sharpen blades regularly and keep away from moisture
- Clean thoroughly between animals to avoid contamination

## 👐 Handling

- Always grip with both hands at the base of handles for max leverage
- Use smooth, even pressure — don't jerk or force
- Store with blade guard on
- Oil blades after use to prevent rust

## Sterilization Details

- Wipe down blades with antiseptic solution or alcohol
- Do not autoclave (can affect hinge and edge alignment)
- Dry thoroughly before storage
- Apply rust-protective oil lightly if unused for long periods

## Veterinary Application

Extensively used by veterinarians and hoof care professionals for **routine hoof trims, corrective trimming, and treatment prep** in horses, cattle, goats, and sheep. Ensures proper foot posture and reduces risk of hoof-related infections or mobility issues.

## Human Application
